KOREA REBORN:

POSTWAR KOREA AS SEEN THROUGH FILM

This course examines Korea as it emerged from the Korean War (1950-1953), and how artists, writers, and film directors began to address the effects of the nation's recovery and rapid modernization. Through periods of dictatorship and democracy, Korean filmmakers produced memorable and powerful narratives. With film screenings, visits by guest speakers, through classroom discussion and excursions to modern and traditional sites in Korea, this course will examine the cultural ramifications of Korea's social, economic, and political shifts since the mid-twentieth century and their legacy on contemporary society as seen through film. In addition to the course on Korean film, students will study Korean language for credit. Multi-track instruction in Korean language reinforces language skills and enriches students' understanding of Korean culture. Students need not have prior experience with Korean language.
