Korea Institute Summer Internship Program

- Set Program Dates June 24-August 17, 2013
- We have had previous intern placements in the fields of government, science/technology, media/journalism, Research Non-Profit Organizations and in the Corporate Business field. Undergraduate students from all years of study and all concentrations will be considered. - Preference given to returning students to Harvard.
- There are internships which require varying degrees of Korean language ability, from no previous Korean language ability to advanced/fluent proficiency.
- Apply via CARAT (<https://asperin.fas.harvard.edu/carat/>), Harvard's web-based common application tool, listed under Korea Institute-Summer Internship Program.
- Application entails: CARAT online KI Internship Application, KI Internship Application from KI website (in addition to CARAT applic.) Resumé, Personal statement (500 words), Official Transcript, 1 Letter of Recommendation (from faculty advisor/member or House Tutor who knows you well), CARAT cover sheet.
- **Application Due: Friday, February 15, 2013**
- Housing: Local University dorms in a double room
- Funding: Up to five interns will be selected by application and interview for this Program. If selected, the funding award to KI Interns is \$3500 from the Korea Institute. Interns will pay for their own airfare and living costs. Housing will be in a shared dormitory room and dorm costs will be covered by the Program. Finalists will be contacted for an interview

◆ The Institute of Politics (IOP) and the KI jointly offer a **Director's Internship at the National Assembly**, South Korea. It is an 8-week internship at the ROK National Assembly, receiving a stipend of \$4000.00 total. Korean/English fluency is strongly preferred. Yonsei International Summer School (YISS) -- PARTIAL TUITION WAIVER

- Usually about a 5-6 week long program
- Award: The tuition waiver covers the university summer tuition and often the application fee. The Korea Institute provides airfare.
***Please note**: Yonsei University has a partial tuition waiver only, covering 1 million Korean Won towards tuition.
[Ewha may offer a 50% tuition discount for the Session II program for students who participate in **both** Session I and II as a set.]
- Cost: The student is responsible for dorm, meal & living expenses. See individual university websites for more cost info.
- May apply to OCS for OCS Summer Study Abroad Grants
- Housing: In dormitory
- The Korea Institute-Summer Tuition Waivers Application (One application for Ewha and Yonsei Universities) will be available in December on CARAT (<https://asperin.fas.harvard.edu/carat/>), Harvard's web-based common application tool, listed under Korea Institute-Summer Tuition Waivers. ****Apply directly to the Korea Institute using CARAT, *not* via the on-line application form for each university****
- Application entails: CARAT online Application, KI Tuition Waiver Application from KI website (in addition to CARAT applic.) Resumé, Statement of Purpose (1pg), Official transcript, 1 letter of Recommendation (from faculty, instructor, TF or Resident Tutor who can best evaluate your academic work), CARAT cover sheet
- **Application due: Friday, February 15, 2013**
- Finalists will be contacted for an interview

- Korean culture and language study in the South Korean capital
- 2013 Program theme is filmmaking, Korean history and Korean Language

- **Dates: June 24-August 17, 2013**
- **HSS in Seoul Application deadline: January 31, 2013**
- **Eligibility:** Students must be at least 18 years old, have completed at least 1 year of college or be a first-year student, and be in good academic standing to apply.
- Complete an HSS online application (available in November) that includes:
 - A \$50 nonrefundable application fee
 - A supplementary statement describing interest in the program, relevant coursework, and travel experience abroad (previous travel is not a prerequisite)
 - Official transcripts (sent directly to the address on website; unofficial transcripts are accepted for Harvard College students only)
- **Accommodations:** Co-ed Dorms (double room) at a host university in Seoul
- **Cost:** \$7,000 (Tuition, Room, Breakfasts, all scheduled excursions and extracurricular activities) + \$50 Application Fee
- **Additional Costs:**
 - Lunches and Dinners (Approx. \$1372=\$28/day for 49 days)
 - a health insurance fee (amount available in early December ~\$200; waived if students have US insurance that provides coverage outside the United States)
 - Transportation to and from Seoul
 - Cost of passports and visas (if the latter is needed)
 - Any immunizations
 - Textbooks & external hard drive
- **Funding:** can be applied for via OCS for a Summer Study Abroad Grant. Students may also apply for limited Korea Institute Scholarships for this program. Students on financial aid are given priority. Awards are made in consultation with the Office of Career Services. You will be asked to submit a budget sheet, along with a written statement of financial need. The budget sheet should include program cost, sources and amount of income, along with an itemized budget. KI Scholarships due: Jan 31 for HSS Applicants.
