KI GRADUATE CONFERENCE ATTENDANCE

GRANT Small grants for Harvard graduate students in any field of Korean studies in the humanities or social sciences to help defray the costs of attending scholarly conferences where one presents a paper or serves as a panel discussant

KI GRADUATE SUMMER LANGUAGE STUDY

GRANT For Harvard master's and doctoral degree candidates in the humanities or social sciences for the summer language study directly related to a thesis/PhD dissertation in Korean studies, which cannot be pursued during the academic year. Priority given to advanced study in a primary language, to the study of a secondary language that is necessary for the completion of the degree, or to the study of a secondary language that is necessary for advanced research.

KI GRADUATE SUMMER RESEARCH GRANT

Travel Grants for graduate degree candidates in the social sciences or humanities for summer research and/or fieldwork in Korea. Proposals from graduate students must relate to your doctoral or master's theses.

KI INTERNATIONAL COMMUNICATION FOUNDATION (ICF) GRADUATE STUDENT FELLOWSHIP IN KOREAN LITERATURE

To support Harvard doctoral candidates whose research focus is on Korean literature who are no longer eligible to receive funding from GSAS financial aid and to foster the growth of young scholars working on Korean literature and culture broadly conceived, with a preference for proposals that include some aspect of Korean translation.

KI SUPPLEMENTARY DISSERTATION
RESEARCH GRANT provides support to Harvard doctoral candidates in the humanities or social sciences, who are pursuing research in any field of Korean studies to be used for dissertation research and writing on campus or during field research in Korea, before the Dissertation Completion Fellowship year.

OFFICE SPACE IN THE KI FOR DOCTORAL STUDENTS (GSAS)

Office space available to doctoral students in the CGIS-South Building whose work focuses on Korea. Seniority is taken into account.

THE KOREA INSTITUTE engages in a variety of programs and events, fostering discussion and research activities among Harvard graduate students, postdoctoral fellows, visiting scholars, faculty, and other members of the Korean studies community.

The Institute organizes the Korea Colloquium/Kim Koo Forum lecture series, which assembles on Thursday afternoons during the academic year.
