CINEMA KOREA:

DOCUMENTING KOREAN SOCIETY THROUGH FILM

JUNE 20 - AUGUST 13, 2016

This course combines a critical and practical introduction to filmmaking, interweaving the close study of films about Korean society with basic training in the essential stages of film production.

We will examine Korea's contemporary place in the world through the lens of sociology combined with the critical study of seminal films along with practical training in documentary filmmaking.

Students will create films engaging and expanding the larger themes explored in class screenings, readings and during a series of visits to major cultural and historic sites across Korea. Equipment and editing software are provided, and students need not have prior experience with either film or Korean language. In addition to the course on Korean film, students will study Korean language for credit. Multi-track instruction in Korean language reinforces language skills and enriches students' understanding of Korean culture.
