Korea Institute Summer Internship Program

- Set Program Dates June 23-August 16, 2014
 - We commonly have intern placements in the fields of government, media/journalism and in the corporate business field. Undergraduate students from all years of study and all concentrations will be considered.  - Preference given to returning students to Harvard.
 - There are internships which require varying degrees of Korean language ability, from no previous Korean language ability to advanced/fluent proficiency. **Although, some Korean ability is *always* preferred.**
 - Apply via CARAT (<https://asperin.fas.harvard.edu/carat/>), Harvard's web-based centralized application tool, listed under Korea Institute-Summer Internship Program.
 - Application entails: CARAT online KI Internship Application, KI Internship Application from KI website (in addition to CARAT applic.) Resumé, Personal statement (500 words), current unofficial Transcript from my.harvard, 1 Letter of Recommendation (from faculty advisor/member or House Tutor who knows you well), CARAT cover sheet.
 - **Application Due: Wednesday, February 12, 2014**
 - Housing: Local University dorms in a double room
 - Funding: Up to four interns will be selected by application and interview for this Program. If selected, the funding award to KI Interns is \$3500 from the Korea Institute. Interns will pay for their own airfare and living costs. Housing will be in a shared dormitory room and dorm costs will be covered by the Program. Finalists will be contacted for an interview
- ◆ The Institute of Politics (IOP) and the KI jointly offer a **Director's Internship at the National Assembly**, South Korea. It is an 8-week internship at the ROK National Assembly, receiving a total stipend of \$4000.00 total. Korean/English fluency is required. Korea Institute Summer Language Study Grants at Ewha

Ewha Womans University-Co-ed International Summer College-Session I

- A 4-6 week long program (typically late June-late July)
- Awards:
The Korea Institute will award three full undergraduate summer language study grants (tuition waivers) for Harvard undergraduates in any concentration to attend the co-ed Ewha International Summer College-Session I, to learn Korean language. You may opt to focus only on Korean language or learn Korean language and take content courses. These full tuition waivers will cover the Ewha application fee, as well as, the tuition fee for Ewha- Session I. The Korea Institute will provide the airfare (economy class, non-refundable, up to \$2000.)
- Cost: Students are still responsible for housing (dorm), meals & general living expenses.
- Students may apply to limited OCS funding for OCS Summer Study Abroad Grants to supplement
- Housing: In dormitory
- The Application will be available on CARAT (<https://asperin.fas.harvard.edu/carat/>), Harvard's web-based centralized application tool, listed under Korea Institute Summer Language Study Grants at Ewha ****Apply directly to the Korea Institute using CARAT, *not* via the on-line application form for Ewha****
- Application entails: CARAT cover sheet, CARAT Application along with budget sheet, 1 page Resumé, Statement of Purpose (~1pg), Current unofficial transcript from my.harvard, 2 letters of Recommendation (from faculty, instructor, TF or Resident Tutor who can best evaluate your academic work, *as well as*, a language instructor's evaluation. This evaluation form is on the KI website.)
- **Application due: Wednesday, February 12, 2014**
- Finalists may be contacted for an interview

- Dates: **June 23-August 16, 2014**
- HSS in Seoul Online Application deadline: **January 30, 2014**
- Eligibility: Students must be at least 18 years old, have completed at least 1 year of college or be a first-year student, and be in good academic standing to apply.
- Complete an HSS online application (available in November) that includes:
 - A \$50 nonrefundable application fee
 - A supplementary statement describing interest in the program, relevant coursework, and travel experience abroad (previous travel is not a prerequisite)
 - Official transcripts (uploaded to the address on website; unofficial transcripts are uploaded and accepted for Harvard College students only)
- Accommodations: Co-ed Dorms (double room) at a host university in Seoul
- Base Cost: \$7,000 (Tuition, Room, Breakfasts, all scheduled excursions and extracurricular activities) + \$50 Application Fee
- Additional Costs:
 - Lunches and Dinners (Approx. \$1372=\$28/day for 49 days)
 - a health insurance fee (amount available in early December ~\$200; waived if students have US insurance that provides coverage outside the United States)
 - Transportation to and from Seoul
 - Cost of passports and visas (if the latter is needed)
 - Any immunizations
 - Textbooks
 - Spending Money
- Funding: can be applied for via OCS for a Summer Study Abroad Grant. Students may also apply for limited Korea Institute Scholarships for this program. Students on financial aid are given priority. Awards are made in consultation with the Office of Career Services. You will be asked to submit a budget sheet, along with a written statement of financial need. The budget sheet should include program cost, sources and amount of income, along with an itemized budget. KI Scholarships due: Jan 30, 2014 for HSS Applicants.
